<b>BIG BOOK (LIBRARY)</b>	<b>KS1</b>	MONDAY	Gurdip Ahadi	Library	Read a story to the children and then do activities around the story.
<b>CHEERLEADING</b>	<b>KS2</b>	MONDAY	Seren (Ascension Eagles) Support Phil Walsh	KS1 Hall	Children will be coached by a professional cheerleading instructor. Working together as team to perfect a routine and challenge in the cheerleading finale.
<b>FOOTBALL</b>	<b>Years 4,5,6</b>	TUESDAY	Bradley Smith	MUGA KS1 Hall	Each week the children will learn new skills and techniques used within different sporting games. They will also play competitive matches to see if the children can implement the skills and techniques learnt within the session. Children will experience working together in teams and the importance of fair play.
<b>BOOKWORMS (LIBRARY)</b>	<b>Years 3, 4</b>	TUESDAY	Gurdip Ahadi	Library	To encourage reluctant readers to read at school and then let them pick a book to take home with them. This will hopefully give them enjoyment in reading something that they have picked themselves rather than us telling them what to read.
<b>MULTISPORTS</b>	<b>Years 1, 2, 3</b>	WEDNESDAY	Ian Tyne Support Phil Walsh	KS1 Hall	Children will receive professional coaching to develop skills from the national PE curriculum. Children will experience working together in teams and the importance of fair play.
<b>YEAR 2 BOOSTER</b>	<b>Years 2</b>	WEDNESDAY	Laura Brothwell	All Saints Classroom	Each week the children will revisit the sounds they have learnt in their phonics sessions and practice applying them through reading and writing activities and games.  They will practice reading these sounds by reading additional phonic books which they will take home with them.  They will visit the library to choose a book of their choice to take home to encourage reading for pleasure.
<b>CHOIR</b>	<b>KS2</b>	WEDNESDAY	Casey Rich	Westferry Classroom	Students learn to find their own individual voices as well as learn ensemble singing skills, including singing in harmony, singing in rounds, etc. Students work towards various performance dates throughout the year.
