Supporting your child's reading: Years 3 & 4







Children should read every night at home. It is important that they read both independently and aloud to an adult.

Reading aloud develops fluency and expression and provides an invaluable opportunity to develop their comprehension, enquiry skills and appreciation of reading.

You will find some useful questions to ask your child to encourage good discussion in the reading record book.

There may be times when a child is reluctant to read and needs encouragement and different strategies in order to engage them. If this occurs your child's class teacher will work closely with you to understand why they are reluctant and endeavour to promote and foster their love of reading.

Some ideas to help reluctant readers are:

- Story CDs,
- Kindles or ebooks
- Visiting libraries or bookshops
- Re-reading familiar texts for pleasure
- Writing to authors
- Reading newspapers and non-fiction texts related to hobbies and interests.
- Guided reading

Using the websites recommended in this booklet can also help reluctant readers find some enjoyment as they don't see it as the same as reading a book. There are lots of texts/websites/games which work on reading comprehension, fluency and interest.
