Question and discussion points to further develop reading:

There is more to being a good reader than just being able to read the words accurately. It is very important that children understand what they are reading. Thinking and talking to your child about what they are reading will help to develop their understanding and enjoyment. Here are a few pointers:

- When and where does the story take place?
- What has happened so far in the story? Has there been anything that has surprised you?
- What do you predict will happen next? Why?
- What does.... mean?
- What does the word... imply about....?
- What do phrases such as.... tell you?
- How has the choice of words created a feeling of....?
- Why did the author choose to...?
- Does the author give any clues about...?
- How was... different after...?
- Describe the author's style of writing.
- Can you identify any words, phrases or descriptions which you feel are particularly effective? Why are they effective?
- How does the author develop the characters?
- Which is your favourite character and why?
- What do you like or dislike about this book?

Suggested reading lists for Year 5 and 6 children:

Please remember that all children learn to read! By the end of Key Stage 2, some children are already very fluent readers, whilst others are still developing their skills.

The listing below is a starting point, with suggested titles for this age group. Any time spent reading will be of benefit to your child – if they find some of these titles difficult, please support their efforts or encourage them to look at less challenging titles. At all stages of their literacy development, children need to enjoy what they are reading – this is the first step on the path to developing a love for books and reading.
